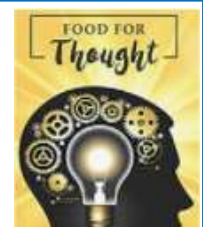

Net Income: \$2,819.56 Budgeted income for 2024: \$3,050.00

Big shout outs for major help on the day of the event: Joe Mazz & his lovely wife Patti, Barry, Dave Taylor and his wife, Dan Beck (once again for 17+ years), & Nick Grieshaber. Shouts out for getting a bunch of guys to play in it: Schwarzman (4 groups), Joe Grohal (3 groups), Sam Bongiovano (2 groups). One item of note that I discovered: Of the 84 players that played this year, just 16 of the players are Knights of Columbus – and a few of these are not from our Council (4 helpers + 1 Wife are from the Council).

We were down substantially with golf sponsors but was able to make it up due to Dixon Golf contacting me to run the 4th Hole betting hole. Also, we received a very large donation of adult beverages from Big Truck Brewery in Monkton, MD! Although we were down this year in net profit, we still made more net profit than any year other than last year.

I see every year how important it is to have the Annual #8891 Rocks Golf Outing and have it consistently the same, year after year. I see the guys outside of the Council are coming year after year from Annapolis, Philadelphia, State College, Chicago and California for it!! (My brother came from San Diego and also a member of the Schwarzman clan). Guys tell me that this is the one event they try not to miss and they even schedule vacations around it (except for one Schwarzman group that got the wrath of the Schwarzman brothers for it LOL ☐).

Motion of Intent to Spend



The following *Motion of Intent to Spend* was made at the June 13th general meeting:

“I move that the council spend up to \$1,250.00 to help pay for a bus for diocesan pilgrimage to Washington, D.C., in November 2024.”

This motion is in response to a request from the parish to have the council help pay for a bus for parishioners who wish to attend the event. It will cover approximately one half of the total cost, and attendees will have to pay for the remainder. Since this is a non-budgeted item, it must be announced to the entire membership so that they are aware of this projected expense, can consider whether to support, amend, or oppose the motion, and decide if they wish to attend the **July 11 meeting when it will be discussed and voted upon**. The reason for this process is that the rules affecting non-budgeted items in excess of \$500.00 cannot be voted on unless all members are made aware of this issue. This must happen whether or not the council has the funds available. If you cannot attend the July meeting, you may comment to your brother Knights who will be there. Understand that while such comments are welcome, you must be present to vote.
